Sixteen year-old Woonsocket male arrested for carjacking:

Central Falls – On September 16, 2015 Central Falls police detectives arrest sixteen year-old for a carjacking reported to police six weeks ago.

The female victim in this case alleged that on August 4, 2015 at approximately 1:30am, she was operating her vehicle on Summer Street, and as she approached the intersection of Summer Street and Dexter Street, she heard a male voice yell out to her. She believed she might have struck something in the roadway so she stopped her vehicle.

The victim then claimed that a heavysset Hispanic male opened her driver side door and struck her in the face. He then, according to her, proceeded to pull her from her vehicle and throw her onto the roadway. The suspect then fled the area in her vehicle at a purported high rate of speed. The vehicle was entered into NCIC as stolen soon thereafter.

On September 12th the vehicle in question was located unoccupied in the City of Pawtucket and towed to the Pawtucket police department for processing.

On September 16th the victim in this case happened to be driving in same area the previous incident occurred and witnessed her assailant riding a bicycle. She immediately called police furnishing his location and clothing description. Central Falls officers responded to the area and detained a 16 year old Woonsocket male whereby the victim positively identified as her assailant.

An arrest warrant was subsequently obtained and the juvenile in question was placed into custody and subsequently charged with the carjacking. He was detained at the training school until his arraignment this morning in Family Court.

He was ordered released this afternoon into the custody of his parents on home confinement with electronic monitoring until his next court date which has not yet been determined.
